What is the difference between interlocking directorates and mergers?

Interlocking directorate

- A board of directors where the majority of members also serve on the board on a competing corporation.
- This is illegal in most countries.

Mergers

 Combined company that results when one corporation buys more than half the stock of another corporation and thus controls the second corporation.

3 types of mergers

- Horizontal merger- 2 or more corporations that merge are in the same industry
- Vertical merger- two or more corporations merge that are involved in a chain
- Conglomerate- large corporation made up of smaller corporations dealing in unrelated businesses.
